### **Background of Health Economics Unit**

#### **Establishment of Health Economics Unit**

- Health Economics Unit (HEU) was established in 1994.
- Initially, it was a project under the Fourth Population and Health Project (PHP) of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW).
- The project was supported by the Overseas Development Administration (ODA) of the United Kingdom.
- HEU was re-organized as a Policy Research Unit (PRU) in the 1st health sector program (1998-2003).
- PRU had three different units.
  - 1. Health Economics Unit.
  - 2. Human Resources Development Unit (HRD) and
  - 3. Gender, NGO and Stakeholder Participation Unit (GNSPU)
- In 2002, the Policy Research Unit (PRU) was renamed again as the Health Economics Unit comprised of GNSP and HEU.
- Quality Improvement Secretariat (QIS) started their work under HEU from 2015.

- 7. Exploring methods for strategic sourcing, effective vendor selection, and fostering robust relationships with suppliers to guarantee the procurement of high-quality, cost-effective healthcare products and services.
- 8. Introducing technological tools and innovations relevant to healthcare procurement, such as e-procurement systems, to enhance efficiency and decision-making.
- 9. Highlighting the significance of procurement decisions on public health outcomes while balancing cost-effectiveness and optimal resource allocation.
